Valentine's Day Throughout the Ages

From the Nottingham Evening Post 1931

In early Victorian days, the Valentine reached the height of its popularity, and became a thing of extravagance, many specimens being real works of art in their particular line. Layer after layer of cut-out paper borders surrounded the picture and verse which were often painted on padded and scented satin. Ribbon and lace, silver and gold thread were all employed, together with little Cupids on paper springs, and the whole delicate structure was packed in a cardboard box and dispatched to the maiden for whom it was destined. Sometimes gifts were inserted in the flat satin pockets, and the designing and manufacture of Valentines became an important industry.

The introduction of a hideous contrast in the form of vulgar Valentines, intended to hurt their recipients, was the first blow to the old custom. Few of the young people of 1931 are even aware that February 14th is Saint Valentine's Day, but surely the ancient saint is as busy as ever, though his emblem no longer flaunt the fact!
